## **2022 - 2023 New Programs**

## Warrior Groups and The Xcelerate Program

One of the most difficult things for a returning service person to deal with is the PTSD accompanying combat experience. Since I have this experience from the Viet Nam war as a U.S. Marine, I understand how this can develop into an addiction, trauma, and conflict with normal everyday living in general. We are currently working with the PTSD Foundation of America to support us in beginning a Warrior Group for combat veterans. This group is a Christ-centered program that brings additional resources to help veterans. Our target is to start in late October 2022; the budget is \$15,000/year.

The Xcelerate Program is about increasing our faith and recovery through Celebrations where we feed, offer live music, a testimony, and a power-packed message of hope. We also include other groups emphasizing spiritual growth; the budget is \$20,000/year.

#### Under The Bridge - Current Program for the Homeless and Helpless

In April of 2021, we began UTB offering food and showers to the homeless and helpless. Since then, the program has shifted to helping individuals within our program structure who are suffering or those in harm's way; the budget is \$15,000/year.

### R.O.P.E. - Reducing Opiate Problems Effectively - New 2022 Program

ATB will use our current and added resources to address the Opiate crisis that is killing off our younger generation. Our proposed program began in July 2022 and will include: 1. Establishing an HA (Heroin Anonymous) meeting at ATB, 2. Providing meetings for family and friends support, 3. Monthly seminars on awareness and overdose prevention. We also have plans to provide educational awareness in Gwinnett County Schools after implementing the first 3 phases of R.O.P.E.; the budget is \$20,000/year.
